I've had to recruit for an open board member position twice within the last year. The way I understand it, if the position vacated by the board member is not up for reelection you can recruit for the position. The new member would only be eligible to fill that position for the remainder of the term. I recruited similar to regular recruitment. I wrote a Press Release and published it on our website, on social media, via print ads, and local media outlets.

I gave candidates 30 days to respond with a letter of interest and resume for the open seat. The board then held a special meeting to interview the candidates with pre-written questions developed by me and legal counsel. On the day of the special meeting, I mediated the interviews, and the board members made motions to appoint their top candidate. They then voted on one person, and it required a majority vote. They were then sworn in at our next regular meeting.

I understand that you have 60 days from the last day of appointment of the current member to fill his/her position. Not really sure what happens if you do not find anyone in time. I've received mixed feedback.

I concur with everything Christal said, and will add that for our Fire District, if a member isn't appointed by the end of 60 days, the next authority up (for us it is the Board of Supervisors) can assign someone to the position instead. Then, when the term for the past board member completes, that new appointed board member is up for election, so the public can then choose to keep them or elect someone else. I'll attach a copy of an old Board Vacancy notice we had from my last District - it states the codes relevant to the process, which I believe are still correct today. Hope that helps!

For our District in Placer County (I think it varies on County Charter rules the process is this

Option A - if more than a year away from the next election, hold a special election for the position that will last for the duration

of the term of the departed board member.

Option B - The Board can appoint a member for the duration of the term or the next election / whichever comes 1st

Then at the next election the position would go up for election, either for a ful term or the remainder of the

term. IF the Board can not appoint someone within (90 Days I think) Then the County Board of Supervisors will

appoint one.

We have had to do this twice including very recently. Shortly before the 2022 Election, and too late to change the ballot - an incumbent

board member fell ill and could not serve, he wound up winning. We as a board due to the cost of a special election chose to appoint

a board member. We put out a public notice requesting applicants - then at a board meeting we held interviews, then we did a process

to vote for a new member, similar to how we choose the board chair. The person selected will serve until the 2024 Election. For that election

the normal cycle is three 4 Year positions - this time there will be three 4 Year Positions and one 2 year position up for grabs. Candidates need to choose which position they want to run for. The appointed member could choose to run for a 4 year spot if they want.

Your district should be careful about what's going on. Government Code 61040(e) says: A member of the board of directors shall not be the general manager, the district treasurer, or any other compensated employee of the district except for volunteer firefighters as provided by Section 53227.

Our last rate study had water and sewer rates based off of water meter size. But with current ADU laws we cannot charge for connection or impact fees. With this being said. Has any water district looked at adding a charge on the monthly bill for any single family homes with multiple buildings on the property being it an ADU or a building over 750sqft? Is this even legal to do? or could it be some kind of policy implemented by the Board of Directors?

I can see the water usage being captured through an existing meter, but what about the sewer and WWTF being impacted by multiple ADUs around the town that is not being considered?

Jose, how do you do your sewer billing? We bill based on EDUs on the tax roll. When an ADU is added, even though we cannot charge capacity fees, we do add the ~0.5 EDUs to their parcel. So in both cases for water and sewer, we are getting either the volumetric billing thru the water meter or the EDU billing via the tax roll for the sewer even though we cannot collect capacity fees. Luckily on the water side, we have enough capacity. On the sewer side, we have less capacity and we may eventually be on a sewer moratorium as we won't have money to expand without the capacity fees.







### A Message from the City Manager

#### Greetings -

You may have heard that the Insurance Services Office (ISO) announced that the City of Temecula achieved an impressive ISO rating of 2, effective July 1, 2023. This rating demonstrates the City's commitment to maintaining high standards in terms of emergency services. It reflects the joint effort between the City of Temecula and CAL FIRE/Riverside County to provide superior fire protection including fire equipment, staffing fire engines with four fire fighters, multiple fire station locations, upgraded equipment, training, excellent water supply, and public education among other various fire protection/prevention efforts.

Every five years the City of Temecula is evaluated on its structure fire suppression capabilities. In 2018, the City of Temecula moved from an ISO score of 4 to a 3. This year, the City will improve again from a 3 to a 2 which is difficult to achieve. An ISO rating of 2

places the City of Temecula within the top 7% for structure fire suppression capabilities in the United States among over 38,000 communities nationwide.


The rating has the potential to affect insurance premiums. While each insurance company independently determines the premiums it charges its policyholders, ISO ratings can impact insurance rates for homeowners and businesses. In this era of escalating insurance premiums, the City encourages residents and businesses to talk with their insurance agent. Lower ISO ratings typically result in lower insurance premiums, which can save money. This is because most U.S. insurers – including the largest ones – use ISO rating information as part of their decision-making when deciding what business to write, coverages to offer, or prices to charge for personal or commercial property insurance. It is our hope the new ISO score of 2 may



translate into potential savings on insurance premiums for homes and businesses within the City.

Importantly, the Mayor, City Council and I share our gratitude to Fire Chief Crater and his team at CAL FIRE/Riverside County for their excellent fire protection for the City of Temecula.

#### INTERESTING POPULATION FACTS

The State of California Department of Finance published the **2023 Price and Population** information, and the City of Temecula had a population decline from 109,468 to 108,899.

The State's overall population decreased by 0.35%, or 138,400 persons. Several components are used to calculate population, including the following:

- Housing unit growth up 0.8%
- Natural increase (births minus deaths) up 106,900 persons
- Foreign immigration up 90,300 persons (tripled from last year)
- Net domestic migration (those moving from another state minus Californians moving to other states) offset all of the above gains, likely due to work-from-home options

The Central Valley and Inland Empire counties experienced growth, while most coastal counties saw declines, except for San Benito. Overall, Riverside County grew slightly as shown below.
