**Re: SB 716 (McGuire) – The Habitat Restoration and Enhancement Act – SUPPORT**

Dear Senator Stern,

On behalf of the California Association of Resource Conservation Districts (CARCD) and the undersigned individual Resource Conservation Districts (RCDs), we write to express our strong support for SB 716 (McGuire), a bill that seeks to extend the Habitat Restoration and Enhancement Act (HREA) that is set to sunset on January 1, 2022. HREA was enacted by AB 2193 (Gordon, 2014), a bill that not one legislator voted against in a policy hearing, fiscal hearing, or floor vote in either house.

California is home to 95 Resource Conservation Districts (RCDs) that serve rural, urban, and suburban populations throughout the state. CARCD represents the network of RCDs comprised of conservation professionals and local experts committed to seeing our landscapes and communities thrive through the local services we provide and the relationships we have forged with our neighbors and colleagues. Many RCDs are at the forefront of preserving California's incredible biodiversity, working with landowners to implement projects and improve practices to enhance the many habitat types across the state.

The Habitat Restoration and Enhancement Act was enacted to create a simplified permitting process at the Department of Fish and Wildlife (DFW) for landowners, state and local government agencies, and conservation organizations to implement small-scale, voluntary habitat restoration and enhancement projects. The underlying basis for AB 2193 was that gaining the necessary agency approvals to implement habitat improvement and clean-water restoration projects can be time-consuming, complicated, and expensive, and, as a result, many project proponents forego opportunities to restore the natural resources under their care.

The expedited permit approval process for DFW created by AB 2193 is a proven success with more than 70 projects implemented to date and the number of projects implemented annually continues to grow. RCDs have utilized the process to implement critical habitat restoration projects in coastal counties from Monterey up to Humboldt, as well as in the inland counties of Shasta, Siskiyou, and Tehama. We anticipate more RCDs implementing restoration projects that that benefit from HREA in the years to come should SB 716 pass.

Governor Newsom's Executive Order N-82-20 highlights the critical role California's biodiversity plays in the state's communities and economy and that biodiversity is in decline. The Executive Order specifically calls out the need to "[i]mplement actions to increase the pace and scale of environmental restoration and land management efforts by streamlining the State's process to approve and facilitate these projects." HREA is a tool that already exists in the state's

toolbox to meet this need, enabling DFW to streamline the approval of voluntary habitat restoration projects and increase the pace and scale of implementing these projects. Extending the sunset by another five years and maintaining this successful policy will help implement EO N-82-20.

CARCD and our undersigned member RCDs are pleased to support SB 716 to extend the HREA. We are grateful to Senator McGuire for his leadership in authoring this bill and respectfully request your “Aye” vote when the bill is heard in committee.

### March 2021 Take Action Brief

As we move into the one-year anniversary of the pandemic, this will be a pivotal month for both federal and state legislation. CSDA's efforts remain focused on gaining access to COVID-19 relief funding in any form, with a growing coalition of 500 organizations across the nation supporting the effort. Once the federal COVID-19 legislative process concludes, CSDA will turn its attention to the need for securing funding for shovel-ready special district capital improvement projects that will repair our community's aging infrastructure and help revitalize our economy.

Other priorities this month include protecting against efforts from interest groups to delay the coming local property tax deadline, which would cut off the lifeblood that many special districts rely on to fund their frontline workers and make payments on bond obligations for critical infrastructure. CSDA also continues to play a leading role in advocating for responsible improvements to the Brown Act and defending against additional unfunded mandates.

### Legislature Makes Early Moves on Revenue-Related Measures

Two significant measures affecting special district revenues underwent positive developments early in the legislative process:

**1. AB 59 (Gabriel) Mitigation Fee Act: fees: notice and timelines – CSDA Opposed.**

This measure has several components that create new mandates and liability on water and utility focused districts.

**2. SB 219 (McGuire) Property taxation: delinquent penalties and costs: cancellation: public health orders.— CSDA Support.**

SB 219 is sponsored by the California Association of County Treasurers and Tax Collectors to allow property tax late payment penalty relief on a case-by-case basis.

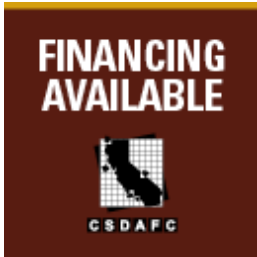

##### Special Districts Must Seek Transfer to Access American Rescue Plan Act COVID-19 Relief Funding

President Joe Biden signed on March 11 the American Rescue Plan Act. The \$1.9 trillion bill includes \$360 billion for state and local government relief. While special districts are explicitly named in the legislation as eligible to receive funding, they did not receive direct access and must now request a funding transfer to address COVID-19 impacts. California is expected to receive an estimated \$42.63 billion from the newly-established Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund, with \$26.6 billion reserved for state programming and the remainder directed to cities...

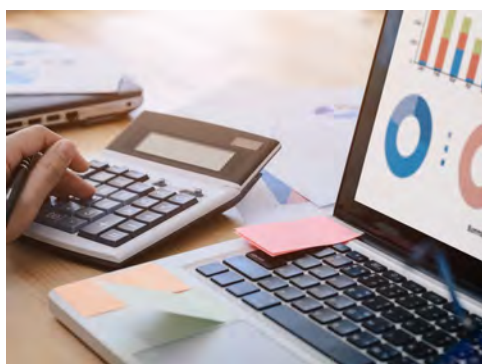
The House and Senate are in session this week. The House will consider 28 bills under suspension of the rules, including the PPP Extension Act of 2021 (H.R. 1799), which provides small businesses two additional months to seek loans through the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP), extending the application deadline from March 31 to May 31.

The purpose of the DFC program is to fund applicants who have never received funding before and to carry out to goals of the program. 1) Establish and strengthen collaboration coalitions working to prevent and reduce substance abuse among youth; and 2) reduce substance abuse among youth, and over time, reduce substance abuse among adults.

## NACD THANKS PARTICIPANTS OF VIRTUAL ADVOCACY WEEK

March 30, 2021



Last week, NACD hosted its 2021 Virtual Advocacy Week, and states ranging from New York to Washington State and Wyoming to Georgia conducted meetings with their elected representatives and agency officials.

### FS and NRCS Seek JCLRP Proposals

## IN WASHINGTON NRCS TRIBAL CONSERVATION ADVISORY COUNCIL

On March 24, several tribes within Washington State met with the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) as part of the Tribal Conservation Advisory Council (WATCAC). Comprised of all federally-recognized tribes in Washington and tribes that have lands in Washington State, WATCAC provides input to Washington's State Conservationist **Roylene Comes at Night** on activities that affect tribes, their natural resources and tribal communities.

The WATCAC has assisted in developing and had final approval of the Tribal Program Strategy that directs NRCS on the foundation of the WA NRCS Tribal Program. A smaller group of tribal staff serves as the tribal local working group to assist NRCS in determining how to allocate the Tribal Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) funding pool, including identifying priority resource concerns and developing ranking questions that are relevant to tribal needs.

At this particular meeting, the robust agenda featured Roylene celebrating the work of the tribes and opportunities to partner with NRCS. **Larry Davis**, chair of NACD's Tribal Outreach and Partnerships Resource Policy Group (RPG) and NACD Pacific Region Representative **Ariel Rivers** participated in the meeting. Together with **Ike Martinez** and **Jacob Turner** of the Spokane Tribe of Indians, NACD presented on the Technical Assistance (TA) Grants and opportunities for new tribal applicants. Davis also invited tribal partners to participate in future RPG meetings.

Through the TA Grant program, Martinez has conducted outreach related to high tunnels and other conservation practices related to forestry and rangelands, while also supporting the Tribe's work on the farm bill and addressing contract needs through EQIP and other programs.

Additional partners also shared information about NRCS and USDA programs, including opportunities for beginning farmers and ranchers and new and upcoming opportunities through the farm bill.

Tribal consultation by federal agencies was also briefly addressed. "The NACD Tribal Resource Policy Group (RPG) has been hearing from BIA, NRCS and FSA on their consultation perspectives," **said Davis**. "Tribal RPG members favor the initiation of consultation earlier in the process of agency rule-writing, a process that is important for tribal members to engage in."

The intent of the partnership is to achieve measurable outcomes through coordinated conservation activities on public and private lands. With a [2020 Friends of NACD District Grant](#), the **Butte SWCD** in Idaho installed a recycling bin in their community for farmers and residents to dispose of agricultural chemical containers. Free for public use, the bin keeps chemical containers out of landfills and their contents from leaching into groundwater.

Implementing this project has helped Butte SWCD form partnerships with two businesses: local chemical supplier and commercial applicator Valley Ag and the Agri-Plas, Inc. waste recycling company.

## TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE GRANTS GET CONSERVATION ON THE GROUND IN NORTH CAROLINA

North Carolina's conservation districts have seen a boost in technical assistance thanks to [NACD technical assistance \(TA\) grants](#) awarded to the North Carolina Division of Soil and Water Conservation. In 2018, the Division received its first round of funding, which it used to boost the technical capacity of the soil and water conservation districts (SWCDs) for **Wilkes, Chatham, Martin, Robeson and Wayne SWCDs**. The Division has since received 2019 and 2020 TA grants and has added the **Columbus SWCD** to its assistance list.

Natural resource concerns vary across the state, so each district's portion of the TA funds was utilized differently. "It's all about getting conservation on the ground, and it takes technical expertise to do that and keep the customer happy," **said Edward Davis**, engineering technician and department head for Columbus SWCD.

In Wilkes County, where there was a major need for boosted forestry outreach and efforts, the Division used some of its grant funds to hire **Daron Brown**, a certified forester, for the conservation district. Brown helped with a lot of conservation activities, but the most common were the establishment of forest trails and landings to minimize the impacts of logging on soil erosion and water quality.

"We were able to put a lot of conservation on the ground due to the expertise that we would not have had if we didn't have Daron on staff," **said Robert Baldwin**, district director from Wilkes SWCD. "In the areas where we employed these practices, you can go back, and you can tell a significant difference compared to the ones where we did not."

The Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) is currently seeking innovative partner-led projects to deliver sustainable agricultural solutions.

NRCS will invest up to \$75 million under the Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP)'s Alternative Funding Arrangements to fund unique projects that take innovative and non-traditional approaches to conservation solutions at the local, regional and landscape scales. NRCS will be holding a webinar at **3:00 p.m. Eastern on April 1, 2021** for interested applicants.

### NRCS Offers CSP Participants Renewal Options

The Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) is currently accepting applications for CSP contract renewals through **March 31, 2021** for the approximately 11,000 CSP contracts that are currently set to expire December 31, 2021. The 2018 Farm Bill made several changes to the CSP program that could benefit producers in a new contract as long as the producer agrees to adopt additional conservation practices on their land above and beyond their current contract requirements. Additionally, as required in the 2018 Farm Bill, NRCS has been reviewing conservation practice standards and has published revised practice standards for 23 practices, including cover

## USDA SEEKS INPUT ON CLIMATE CRISIS

On January 27, President Biden issued an Executive Order titled "Tackling the Climate Crisis at Home and Abroad," which directed the Secretary of Agriculture to solicit input once again from stakeholders on "how to encourage the voluntary adoption of climate-smart agricultural and forestry practices that decrease wildfire risk fueled by climate change and result in additional, measurable and verifiable carbon reductions and sequestration."

On March 15, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) [released a federal register notice](#) to officially begin soliciting this feedback. The input requested is on "how to best use Department of Agriculture programs, funding and financing capacities, and other authorities, and how to encourage the voluntary adoption of climate-smart agricultural and forestry practices that decrease wildfire risk fueled by climate change and result in additional, measurable, and verifiable carbon reductions and sequestration and that source sustainable bioproducts and fuels."

With increased focus on the role agriculture can play in addressing climate change, it is vitally important that USDA receives input from the conservation district community on the ways that districts can help drive this effort. District staff are already involved in promoting climate-smart agriculture and forestry practices, and NACD strongly encourages your state association or individual district to provide comments by the **April 15** deadline. 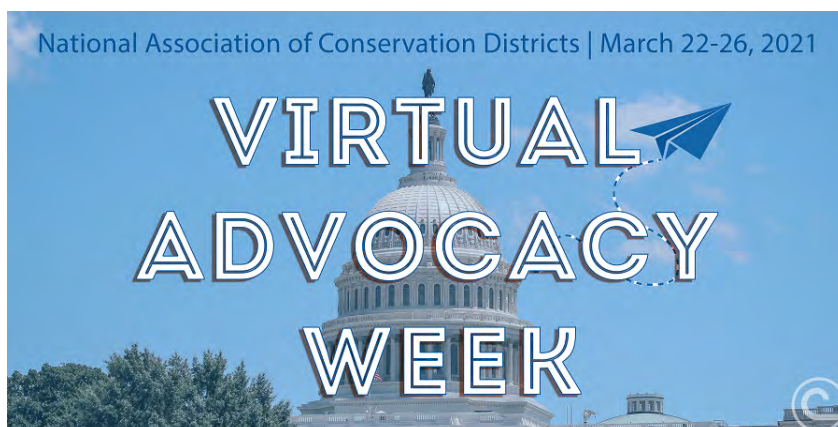

**Lincoln, Gaston and Mecklenberg Soil and Water Conservation Districts** (SWCD) joined forces to open a forest to the public in North Carolina for forestry and SWCD educational programs, an effort that resulted in state funding for the project.

In 2011, through a partnership with the **North Carolina Association of SWCDs** (NCASWCD) and the state forestry agency, the three conservation districts met and lobbied county commissioners and state legislators. It took several years, but in 2018, the State Legislature allotted in its budget more than \$3 million to construct a 6,000 square-foot education center with public amenities at the Mountain Island Lake Educational State Forest (MIESF). The group hopes to have a grand opening later this year.

“Education is one of the most important things we do, and this facility lends itself to educating our youth to the topic of a diminishing resource,” Mecklenburg SWCD Vice Chair **Nancy Carter said**.

“Our urbanization is rapidly increasing,” **she said**. “Giving urban youth an outdoor educational experience and showing them their water source plus educating them to its use and value and its decreasing availability will be enormously beneficial.”

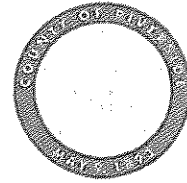

**BACKGROUND:**

**Summary**

Temecula-Elsinore-Anza-Murrieta Resource Conservation District (“TEAM RCD”) is a resource conservation district, the territory of which covers approximately 789 miles of the County of Riverside, extending south from Scott Road in Murrieta to the San Diego County line, east of Anza west to the Orange County line, and including a loop around the north of Lake Elsinore.

In years past, TEAM RCD contracted with private attorneys for legal services, later receiving them from the Office of County Counsel, and more recently receiving them from Best Best & Krieger LLP. TEAM RCD recently contacted the County requesting to again obtain legal services from the Office of County Counsel. The attached agreement provides for general legal services to be provided to TEAM RCD upon its request up to a maximum amount of \$10,000 per fiscal year. The agreement has been approved by the TEAM RCD Board of Directors and approved as to form by County Counsel.

**Impact on Residents and Businesses**

The agreement provides legal services to TEAM RCD so it may continue its important business and perform its services for residents within the TEAM RCD service area.

**Additional Fiscal Information**

Revenue under this agreement is dependent on how often TEAM RCD calls upon the Office of County Counsel for services. Revenue may be from \$0 up to 10,000 per fiscal year.

**Contract History and Price Reasonableness**

Charges to TEAM RCD are the same rates approved by the Board of Supervisors and charged to all Office of County Counsel clients.

21 determined that Counsel will provide services, District shall be charged for the legal services provided in

23 VI. INVOICES, RATES AND PROCEDURES FOR REIMBURSEMENT. Counsel shall bill  
24 District for all attorney and paralegal services rendered at an hourly rate established by the Board of  
25 Supervisors and such other costs as may be directly related to the services provided. (Hourly rates for  
26 Fiscal Year 2020/2021 for attorney services are \$187.00 and \$120.00 for paralegal services, and for Fiscal  
27 Year 2021/2022 for attorney services are \$187.00 and \$107.35 for paralegal services. Rates are adjusted  
28 each Fiscal Year.) Counsel shall provide District with an invoice with a Summary of Legal Services

1 Rendered each month. Monthly billing invoices shall be submitted to District within twenty-one (21)  
2 days after the end of each month in which services are provided. Monthly billing invoices account for  
3 services rendered with hourly units of service rounded to the nearest 1/10<sup>th</sup> of an hour. Billing invoices  
4 shall also list a description of the activity for which payment is requested, including case name, activity

6 District shall notify Counsel in writing within ten (10) working days of receipt of any dispute  
7 concerning individual charges and shall include a basis for the dispute. In the event Counsel determines

10 VII. REIMBURSEMENT RECORDS AND AUDITS. Counsel shall maintain auditable books,  
11 records, documents and other evidence pertaining to costs and expenses in this Agreement. Counsel shall  
12 maintain these records for three (3) years after final payment has been made or until all pending county,  
13 state, and federal audits, if any, are completed, whichever is later.

14 Any authorized representative of the District, the State of California, and the federal government  
15 shall have access to any documents, papers, electronic data, and other records, which these representatives

1 VIII. GENERAL PROVISIONS.

- 2 1. As a special district within Riverside County, District and Counsel will work  
3 cooperatively to support the core mission of the other. To this end, Counsel and

1 IX. REPRESENTATIONAL CONFLICTS.

2 District acknowledges that Counsel serves as Riverside County's legal advisor and representative  
3 on all matters. Counsel also serves as the legal advisor for a number of other separate legal entities that  
4 are governed by the same five individuals who sit as the Board of Supervisors for the County ("Related  
5 Public Entities"). Counsel must preserve its ability to represent the County and Related Public Entities  
6 on matters that may arise in the future, including matters in which the County's and/or Related Public  
7 Entities' interests are adverse to District's interest. Counsel is not willing to undertake representation of  
8 District in the absence of District's consent as set forth in this section because Counsel must preserve the  
9 ability to represent its primary client, the County, and Related Public Entities. District's engagement of  
10 Counsel with respect to any particular matter includes District's consent to Counsel's ongoing  
11 representation of its primary client, the County, and Related Public Entities, in all matters, including  
12 transactions and litigation, in which the interests of the County and/or Related Public Entities are  
13 potentially or actually adverse to the interests of District and notwithstanding that Counsel may have  
14 obtained confidential information from District subject to the conditions below.

15 At the time District engages the services of Counsel for a particular matter, Counsel will inform  
16 District based on the available facts of any specific matters in which the County's interests and the  
17 District's interests are then actually or potentially adverse. As of the date this Agreement is signed by  
18 District, Counsel is not aware of any actual or potential conflicts of interest.

19 Counsel is governed by specific rules relating to representation of clients when present or potential  
20 conflicts of interest exist. Those rules are outlined in Rule 3-310 of the California Rules of Professional  
21 Conduct.

22 Neither the County, Related Public Entities, District nor Counsel intends to provide for Counsel's  
23 continuing representation of both District and the County in matters where the interests of District and the  
24 County or Related Public Entities are actually adverse or where a dispute arises between District and

7 District are potentially or actually adverse has significant implications that District has considered. By  
8 signing this Agreement, District acknowledges that it has been advised of the potential conflicts  
9 associated with concurrent representation; that it has been advised of Counsel's present and continuing  
10 relationship with the County and Related Public Entities; and that District, upon requesting assistance  
11 from Counsel on a particular matter, and having been presented with the information about potential and  
12 actual conflicts of interest as required by this section, provides its consent under Rule 3-310 of the Rules  
13 and Professional Conduct to Counsel's ongoing representation of the County and Related Public Entities,  
14 notwithstanding any potential or actual conflict of interest between the County (and/or Related Public  
15 Entities) and District that may develop. District waives any and all rights to disqualify Counsel from  
16 representing the County (and/or Related Public Entities) based on a conflict of interest arising out of  
17 concurrent representation of the County (and/or Related Public Entities) and District's consent and waiver  
18 extends to "subsequent representation," whereby reason of Counsel's former representation of District in  
19 a matter, Counsel has confidential information material to a matter in which the County's (and/or Related  
20 Public Entities') interests are adverse to District's interests, and Counsel no longer represents District in  
21 any matter.

22 In addition, Counsel represents other public entities in the County. In the event that an  
23 unanticipated actual or potential conflict of interest arises between or among two or more non-County  
24 public-entity clients represented by Counsel during the course of representation of District, Counsel will  
25 immediately notify District of the actual or potential conflict and either (1) District will acknowledge and  
26 waive the actual or potential conflict, in which case Counsel will erect an ethical wall between the  
27 attorney representing District and the attorney representing the other non-County public entity client; or  
28 (2) if District declines to waive the actual or potential conflict, Counsel will withdraw from representing

1 all non-County public-entity clients in that matter. If Counsel will withdraw from representing all non-  
2 County public-entity clients in a matter, District acknowledges that it is free to hire substitute counsel of  
3 its own choosing and at its own expense.

4 X. Effective Date.

5 This Agreement will govern all legal services performed by Counsel on behalf of Client  
6 commencing with the date Counsel first performed services. The date this Agreement was signed is for  
7 reference only. Even if this Agreement does not take effect, District will be obligated to pay Counsel the  
8 reasonable value of any services Counsel may have performed for District.

9 XI. Complete Agreement; Amendment.

10 This Agreement, together with any exhibits thereto, expresses the understandings of the parties  
11 concerning all matters covered and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations or agreements, either  
12 written or oral. No additions to, or alteration of, the terms of this Agreement, whether by written or  
13 verbal understanding of the parties, their officers, agents or employees, shall be valid unless made in the  
14 form of a written amendment to this Agreement and formally approved by the parties.

**SUBMITTAL TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE,  
STATE OF CALIFORNIA**

- a) Two hundred twelve (**212**) or fewer fee parcels will be offered for a minimum bid of cost of sale only.
- b) One hundred seventy-two (**172**) or fewer fee parcels will be offered at a minimum bid of taxes only, plus cost of sale.
- c) Three hundred (**300**) or fewer fee parcels will be offered at a minimum bid of \$100.00.

In general, the financial impact of tax sales can be summarized as follows:

- Sales at, or above, the amount of taxes owed have no direct negative impact on the County's budget.
- For this sale, if all parcels being reoffered for cost of sale were to sell for only the minimum bid, the maximum tax loss would be \$3,130,696.71. Considering the Teeter formula, which shares this loss with other taxing entities, the maximum loss of the Tax Loss Reserve Fund would be \$2,123,551.75. Parcels reoffered for taxes only, plus cost of sale will not realize a tax loss.
- Accordingly, there should be no direct impact on the County General Fund because reserves exceeding the amount have been set aside.
- The Tax Collector has determined that parcels which are offered for a minimum bid of \$100.00 should stimulate interest through the online auction. All of the parcels in question have previously been offered for sale, most on multiple occasions, without garnering any bids. While the \$100.00 minimum bid is low, we believe it is necessary in order to generate interest and bids. It is further likely, that once bidding begins, the final highest bid will decisively surpass the \$100.00 minimum.
- More likely than not, there will be minimal impact upon the Tax Loss Reserve Fund itself. Based upon recent experience, this sale is not expected to realize the maximum loss for three reasons: (1) properties are inevitably pulled from the sale due to various reasons including taxpayer redemptions; (2) some parcels will sell for more than the minimum bid; and (3) other parcels are likely to receive no bids. For example, in previous tax sales, our estimated maximum loss of the Tax Loss Reserve Fund for 2018-2019 was \$1,663,823.42 however, our realized loss was \$451,810.69 which resulted in only 27% of our initial estimated loss. Additionally, our estimated maximum loss of the Tax Loss Reserve Fund for 2019-2020 was \$2,640,702.78 however, our realized loss was \$499,823.88 which resulted in only 19% of our initial estimated loss.

**Impact on Residents and Businesses**

The offering of tax-defaulted properties is to collect unpaid taxes and to return the property to a revenue-generating status by conveying the property to another owner or motivating the assessee to redeem.
