9.1 Agency: Bob Hewitt, NRCS:

NRCS audit completed, projects: 1) drainage plan for B&B at Rancho California Rd and Anza Rd., 2) animal waste management plan for Moark chicken ranch NE of Vail Lake off of Sage Rd.,3) Frank Chan's avocado farm—installation of new drain lines that replace those burned in the Sta. Rosa fire.,3) Sta. Rosa, Cahuilla and Ramona indian reservation grazing plans,4) finishing up tree removal. 560,000 tress have been removed from San Bernardino, Riverside and San Diego counties.

9.2 Dir. Whitington: Temecula City is going forward with the proposed annexation of the property south of town that includes the Liberty Quarry project. The City of Murrieta is backing them.
