Report on proposed Baseline Funding for RCDs from the State: Paul Williams (Area chair of the SoCal Inland Region) and Mandy Parks (IERCD)

Paul met with the CARCD along with the Area RCD representatives for a quarterly meeting. Paul was impressed with the CARCD and how they work on Bills and conservation strategy. They know all the legislators and non-profits.

The RCDs major "asks" were to be recognized and more visible and to be assisted in funding. To receive funding the RCDs need to follow basic criteria that Paul and Mandy discussed. They passed out information on the Tier 1, 2 and 3 scoring levels that we will need to follow. Once the RCDs are compliant, the Dept. of Conservation will ask for funding from the CA State Budget. Some RCDs will be eliminated and it is recommended that some merge. For instance, we could merge with San Jacinto Basin.

--34 Cost-sharing applications were accepted for irrigation improvements. They can receive soil sensors, retrofitting of equipment and advice from this funding. This program is funded by Rancho Water District from a grant that is matched by the local NRCS EQUIP funding.

He is helping the tribes, Santa Rosa and Cahuilla Reservations with irrigation improvements and cattle management.

Another program is an air quality program to get rid of all old tractors due to the pollution impacts of these vehicles.

He's working with farmers to make Agricultural erosion control plans.
