- -- Developers are looking for mitigation in our District (mostly looking for credits from a land bank).
- --Nelson: Rancho Water District sent a notice about a grant for drinking water quality in DAC areas. She wondered about Quail valley. This area is not in our district. The Los Alamos area is a DAC and Long submitted a project to help them get water in the last round of the IRWM.

2.1 Acceptance of Director Kathi Head's resignation from the Board

Head is participating in the Natural Resources Volunteer Program (NRVP) that is part of the CDFW. Their goal is to protect the wildlife and reduce the interaction of people, pets and wildlife. Riverside and San Bernardino Counties have an active program and has been recruiting people. She distributed CDFW materials. The educational pamphlets they use are to help the public understand how to live with and protect wildlife. Another

program is about being aware of what goes into our storm drains. Awareness of ways to alert rangers of poachers and other illegal activities is another effort. Invasive species is another program, particularly for boaters. Hunting and fishing educational programs are available.

She's an unpaid employee of the State. She has to pass all the tests and be certified.

Because of this new venture, Head has given us a letter of resignation from our Board. She would like to remain as an Associate Director. Motion to accept her resignation, Thomasian, Nelson; 3-0, 1 abstain (Head) Nelson (yes), Long(yes), Thomasian (yes)
